LETTER TO THE MENNAISIAN FAMILY

MODALITIES OF COMMITMENT OF THE LAITY

These few lines are meant to remind you briefly of the elements of the text of Reference of the Mennaisian Family. They can help men and women who think about the type of commitment that they wish to have within the framework of the Mennaisian Family. It is not enough merely to read them. In order to go further, it is essential that a dialogue takes place between the Layperson who wishes to deepen this link of membership and a Brother.

The Mennaisian Family constitutes a big community in the sense of solidarity and fraternity which are rooted in the Charism of the foundation of the Congregation of the Brothers of Christian Instruction (Mennaisian Educational Mission, Mennaisian Spirituality and Communion).

We distinguish three main modalities of commitment of the Laity in the Mennaisian Family:

- 1. COLLABORATION : Every person who participates in one way or another in the Mennaisian Educational Mission and provides a positive and stimulating outlook collaborates effectively in the educational work.
- **PARTICIPATION:** 1.
 - From mission to spirituality: The Laity who participate in the Mennaisian mission in an educational work find in it a source to live the Gospel and are nourished by it to experience God in the heart of their own life.
 - From spirituality to mission: The Laity who share elements of the Mennai-• sian Spirituality find a call in it to be committed to the educational mission, be it in or outside an educational work.
- **BELONGING** : Some Lay people perceive in the Mennaisian Charism a way of life 3. that is proper to them and which touches all the facets of their family and professional existence. It is a vocational option. This approach, created by the Church, touches a person in his relation with God and other people in the dynamics of baptism.

LAY CORRESPONDENT

During the last General Chapter at Ploërmel in March 2012, the Mennaisian Laity who were present for many days to share with the Brothers wished that "under the responsibility of the General Council of the Congregation an international committee of the Mennaisian Family should be set up".

Meanwhile, before setting up the organisation of the international committee, we have wished that a Lay correspondent be appointed in every country or every Province of the Congregation.

The objective of this choice is to establish a fraternal relationship between the General Council and the Mennaisian Laity throughout the world.
