Dear Lay Mennaisians, Dear Brothers,

At this time when the whole world is facing the Corona virus which affects its daily life and which mobilises the front page of the media, how can we remain insensitive to the different cries of those who are suffering and who call for help? Many of us are already directly concerned: schools are closed and others are forced to stay at home. What can we do? What does the Lord ask of us in these difficult times? How to interpret this sign of the times and how to respond to it?

**To take care**! This seems to be the common denominator of what we are experiencing today. The medical profession cares with dedication and selflessness for all those affected by this pandemic. Parents take care of their children with creativity and intuition. Educators continue to feed their students, when possible, using new information and communication technologies. Our pastors, especially Pope Francis, strive to keep the flock by being close with tenderness and compassion.

And we, Mennaisian Family, how to respond to this invitation to take care? Four elements of response: **respect**, **solidarity**, **fraternity** and **prayer**.

- By raising our hearts and our hands to the Lord to intercede for all the mobilised health personnel and all the educational teams of closed schools, children and young people, families and especially the people affected by this pandemic, this will be the expression of our faith in the strength and effectiveness of **prayer**. May the entire Mennaisian Family entrust this intention of prayer to the intercession of Jean-Marie de la Mennais during the Novena scheduled from the 18<sup>th</sup> to the 26<sup>th</sup> March, 2020. May this chain of prayers continue until the end of the pandemic. Let's not be afraid to knock! The Lord will answer!
