Funeral of Pope Francis, St. Peter's Square, Saturday, April 26, 2025.

To everyone's surprise, Cardinal Kevin Farrell announced that Pope Francis died in Rome, at Santa Marta House in the Vatican, on Easter Monday, April 21, 2025, at 7:35 a.m., at the age of 88. His funeral was held on Saturday, April 26, 2025, in St. Peter's Square, and was attended by more than 400,000 people.

Throughout his ministry, Pope Francis had strived, through his life, words and actions, to be a sign of hope, especially for migrants, the poor, the elderly and prisoners.

With Cardinal Giovanni Battista Re, Dean of the College of Cardinals, let us take up his request to Pope Francis, which is certainly that of all the people who have regained hope thanks to his presence and his closeness:

"Dear Pope Francis, we ask you now to pray for us and that, from heaven, you may bless the Church, bless Rome, bless the whole world, as you did last Sunday from the balcony of this basilica, in a final embrace with all the people of God, but also, ideally, with humanity that seeks the truth with a sincere heart and holds high the torch of hope" (Homily, April 26, 2025).

Inauguration of the Pontificate of Pope Leo XIV

On the evening of Thursday, May 8, 2025, Cardinal Dominique Mamberti announced the election of a new Pope. He is Cardinal Robert Francis Prevost, 69 years old, born in Chicago, a member of the Order of Saint Augustine and a missionary in Peru for some twenty years. He has chosen the name Leo XIV.

On Sunday, May 18, 2025, our new Pope presided over the mass in St. Peter's Square, marking the official beginning of his Pontificate, in the presence of more than 200,000 people.

Here is an excerpt from his homily which expresses the meaning he gives to his mission :

«I was chosen without any merit and, with fear and trembling, I come to you as a brother who wants to be the servant of your faith and your joy, walking with you

on the path of God's love, who wants us all to be united in one family » (Homily, May 18, 2025).

We assure Pope Leo XIV of the support of our prayer and we commit ourselves, at his call, to live each day our faith *«so that we may be filled with the hope that only Jesus Christ can give us»* (Pope Leo XIV, May 26, 2025).

Editorial Signs of hope

In the Induction Bull for the 2025 Jubilee, Pope Francis identified eight cries of distress that Christians are called to transform into signs of hope. The tragedy of war awaits peacemakers (Mt 5:9). The declining birth rate in some parts of the world constitutes a call to promote the transmission of life. The situation of prisoners, deprived of freedom and dignity, calls for the help of every person of good will to restore hope. The sick, whether at home or in hospital, need the closeness and affection of relatives, friends, and Good Samaritans. Young people, the joy and hope of the world and the Church, seek companions who help them maintain their enthusiasm and their dream of a better world. *Migrants* seek a welcoming land and a home where they can live in safety. The elderly, weighed down by loneliness, cry out for presence and attention. Poor people would rather learn to fish than receive a fish every day.

In this Holy Year, how can we respond to these calls for help, wherever we live? Like Saint Francis of Assisi, wherever there is war, let us be peacemakers. And Pope Leo XIV shows us the way :

« Let us disarm communication of all prejudice, rancor, fanaticism, and hatred; let us purify it of all aggression. We do not need thunderous and muscular communication, but rather communication capable of listening, of gathering the voices of the weak who have no voice. Let us disarm words and help disarm the Earth » (May 12, 2025).

Where there is death, let us spread life. Where there is sadness, let us sow joy. Where there is darkness, let us bring light. Where lies germinate, let us make truth flourish. Where hatred and discord take root, let us plant love. In concrete terms, this means:

- to give food and drink to the hungry and thirsty,
- welcome the stranger,
- to clothe the naked,
- visit the sick and the prisoner (Mt 25:31-46),
- take care of young people.

This means: to be signs of hope for those around us!



The Mennaisian Family of the Teodelina Fernández de Alvear School has been supporting the San Damián Center in Villa Gobernador Gálvez, Argentina, for over 15 years, helping children and young people in precarious situations. This Center is located on the site of a chapel founded around the year 2000 by Capuchin Father Luis Dri (now cardinal) and Sister Daniela Cannavina, a Capuchin nun.

The San Damián Non-Formal Education Center opened its doors in 2021. This project grew in importance and the need for a larger space to better accommodate children was recognized. A loan application was submitted to the municipality to use a neighboring plot of land.

In 2024, we sought help from SAL (Spain) and ASSIFIC (France) to acquire and adapt four 12-meter-long containers. Thanks to the help of our Cardenal Copello school (Buenos Aires) and other voluntary contributions, we were able to acquire them in 2025. To mark a new beginning, the center will have a new name: Juan María.

« For my part, after four months in East Timor and after two weeks of teaching, I have noticed a general low level among the students and very little interest in using the Portuguese language. On the other hand, for our integration, it is really important that we know and practice Tetun, even if many of the young people we meet prefer that we use English! We still have a long way to go. We are counting on your fraternal support. » Br. Stéphane Le Pape

« I am happy with the warm welcome, spontaneity, proximity and availability of the Timorese, especially towards the Consecrated; which facilitates our integration and learning of Tetun. We hope to have as soon as possible a pastoral insertion in order to be closer to young people, to children and to perfect our language skills. « My colleagues and I are excited about our first experience in this new mission country. Despite our apprehensions, we are filled with hope and joy. Joy, the fruit of a community that welcomes its mission and the warm welcome of the Timorese

people, is essential for our integration. It soothes us. It's really good to live here, despite the climate being a bit harsh. The difficulties we've encountered so far are related to the language. There isn't one language, but many. Linguistic diversity is indeed a challenge, especially for teaching, where we can switch from one language to another during the same lesson. » **Br. FRANCE : At the roots of our hope

Twelve plaques mark the Mother House to help pilgrims immerse themselves in the place and allow themselves to be imbued with the advice of Jean-Marie de la Mennais. Mennaisians and visitors can thus go to the source and enter, little by little, into the secret of Jean-Marie de la Mennais's life. This is what Lay people and Brothers will do during our next capitular assembly, which will take place in October 2025 and which we are already preparing through various Mennaisian evenings.

BOLIVIA and HAITI : Service for the Poorest

1 - Bolivia: Restarting your life...

At the «Aynjasiñani» Center in the city of El Alto, a new project, «Connect - Connect Yourself", has been launched since the beginning of 2024. Specifically, it involves welcoming young people and adolescents from the educational organization who are experiencing academic failure. We offer them breakfast, support tailored to their situation, and lunch. Thus, we work with them, at their own pace and according to their specific needs.

This project is possible thanks to numerous volunteers: parents, educators, students, and thanks to the help of the NGO SAL.

2 - Haiti: Educating the street children of Cité Soleil

Located in the largest slum of Cité Soleil, in Port-au-Prince, the educational center: Centre Éducatif Noël des Anges (CENA) welcomes, despite the situation of violence that prevails in this neighborhood, children who are not in school, often too old to enter a first year of traditional schooling. By offering them a quality education, the CENA empowers them to build a better future. It embodies for them a fairer and more equitable future.

We salute the generosity of donors past and present, that of our schools of the Saint Louis de Gonzague Province who, through their contributions, support us in our fight against social exclusion and help us to bring smiles back to these children during their school career. We also salute the availability of the Brothers and Lay people who spare neither their time nor their energy to be present among our little brothers and sisters of Cité Soleil. We thank them wholeheartedly.



RWANDA – CONGO – UGANDA – SOUTH SUDAN : Boldness of the call and the formation to the consecrated life

1- Rwanda :

Dare to go to the peripheries to call

The Brothers of the Commission for the Pastoral Care of Vocations of the District of Notre-Dame de Kibeho visited Dioceses in the country where we are not established in order to present our Institute to young people who are thinking about a vocation to the consecrated life.

We ask the Lord to bless what has been sown so that it may bear fruit a hundredfold, sixtyfold, thirtyfold (Mt 13:23).



2 - RD Congo : Leave everything to follow Christ

This year, the Bunia Postulate welcomes nine young people from several regions of the country, notably from Aba, from Bunia, Dungu, Isiro and Kinshasa. It is a real sign of hope for the District to see young people who want to follow Christ more closely in the manner of Jean-Marie de la Mennais and Gabriel Deshayes.

We give thanks to God for these young people who have decided to leave everything for Christ and we ask Him to bless their journey in our Institute.

3 - Uganda – South Sudan : Promoting vocations to Brothers

Since the last General Chapter, efforts have been made to promote vocations to the life of a Brother. This has begun to bear fruit. In the first year, there are 12 postulants: 7 from Uganda and 5 from South Sudan. The presence of these young people allows the Province to look to the future with confidence and hope.

TANZANIA – KENYA : Commitment to quality education

The Brothers of the Province of Saint Michael the Archangel (Tanzania – Kenya) do their best to provide quality education and to make Jesus Christ known and loved by children and young people. They educate through their presence and closeness.



Brother Roger was a solid, proud, and original man throughout his life. He succeeded in every role and responsibilities entrusted to him. A scientist by nature and passion, he was organized, methodical, and meticulous. He is certainly one of the few FICs to have piloted an airplane, and his own plane at that.

Born in Mauricie (more than a century ago!), he returned there to live out his final years. He leaves his colleagues the memory of a friendly, interesting and curious-about-every-thing elder, who loved to converse, laugh, and run behind his walker,



and curious-about-every-thing Bros Mario Houle, Roger LeBlanc, Mgr Martin Laliberté, Bishop of Trois-Rivières, elder, who loved to converse, during his 90 years of religious life and during his 106th birthday.

Renovation of the Paul VI College opened by the Brothers in 1978. Over time, the college was becoming too small. Solutions had to be found to meet demand. Classes were overcrowded: an average of 60 students.

The project, financed by three Swiss NGOs, includes the construction of 18 new class-

rooms (two blocks of 9 each) for the Collège and a new High School from the next academic year, the new toilets and changing rooms, the construction of the boys' dormitory, the multi-functional sports ground and the complete renovation of the old classrooms. The former Community of Brothers becomes the administrative block of the College.
